Lessons for Today

THE LIGHTHOUSE

It is a common practice to place peculiar looking structures resembling towers along rocky coasts. At night, these lighthouses shine forth to warn any sea-faring vessels of the dangerous shoals nearby. The light is visible for many miles at sea. During foggy, or stormy weather, because the light is obscured by the elements, most lighthouses also have additional warning devices called foahorns.

The lighthouse keeper polishes and cleans the glass in the tower so the light is always visible. The foghorn is loud and deep sounding so it penetrates the fog. Imagine the terrible danger if the keeper was asleep and the light went out! Imagine the uncertainty if the foghorn was defective, and only produced the warning sound at odd intervals! Or worse vet, imagine that the lighthouse was abandoned, and no longer served as a warning to those afloat! No, the light has to be bright, and the sound has to be clear and sure to guarantee the safety of those who depends on the warning.

To the modern world in the darkness of sin, the church is that lighthouse on the shore sending forth the warning of danger. Without the clear and certain sound of the truth, the lost in the world are destined to crash on the rocks of sin and its consequences. To those we know and love, we are the only thing that can prevent this disaster. WE are their lighthouse.

We are the keepers of the light Ye are the light of the world... Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven. (Matthew 5:14, 16), and must make sure that our signal of danger is clear and certain. We must also make sure that our warning of danger is constant and continuous. We must be like the lighthouse keeper, constantly polishing and cleaning so the warning goes out into the darkness. Notice that the lighthouse keeper is safe on the shore, even protected from the very dangers he warns others about. We do not have to experience the wickedness of the world to warn others of its consequences. Like the lighthouse keeper, we are in a position to see the "rocks" and signal a warning.

In the safe haven of the church, it is easy to think the danger no longer exists, and become lax in our warnings. Changing the definition of sin does not change the nature of sin. Society's acceptance of sinful behavior does not change the nature of sin. The wages of sin is still death, no matter what we think or feel. (Romans 6:23)
