WHY CAN'T THINGS JUST STAY THE SAME?

Wouldn't it be "neat" if we could take our 6 month, 3 year, 11 year, 16 year, old child and "freeze" time so they would never change? They would always be in that "cute" stage. They would never grow up and face the world, leaving us to pursue the adventures of life on their own. Not only is that impossible, it just would not work. All of us realize that this desire is just a dream, for growth and the changes that accompany it are natural and proper.

From conception, the unborn infant undergoes constant change. These changes continue until the last breath is exhaled. Often these changes are difficult, sometimes even painful. As time passes, there are bumps, bruises, falls and tears. We even speak of "growing pains." Even if we could, none of us would really want to stop this process.

I have in my hand a very small acorn. It is so much smaller than the oak tree it fell from, that it seems insignificant in comparison. Yet, under the right conditions, it has the potential to become a mighty oak itself. But to reach that point, the small seed in my hand must go through several changes. First it must die (John 12:24; 1 Corinthians 15:36ff). It goes into the ground, gives of itself, becoming something totally different in appearance. As the young oak grows it must reach deep within the soil and high into the sky for sustenance and nourishment, its looks changing from season to season.

As Christians, we too undergo constant change—as long as we are growing. Like the oak we must reach deep into God's word and high toward an improved relationship with God. Each stage of this growth, from babe in Christ to teaching, even to serving as an elder, represents change. There are changes in knowledge, experience, perspective, spirit, and even personality.

Churches also endure change in order to grow. From the humblest of beginnings, congregations go through stages of growth that mirror the changes seen in individuals -- physically and spiritually. There are times of rapid, almost explosive growth. Then there are times of no growth at all. Churches are like children, with periods of growth spurts and periods of "always staying the same".

Change, merely for the sake of change, or even just because we can, is not a good or healthy thing. Nevertheless, change is a necessary part of growth. In fact, growth cannot happen without change! As we look forward to the future and plan for growth, let us realize that there will be changes. Let us also make sure that those changes are forward and growth related, and not just because we can.
